## Sakura Gakuen's Adult School

offers courses on Monday evenings designed for busy people. Small classes provide more individual attention. Course instructors are native Japanese speakers. Quick travelers learning courses, conversational classes without learning kana or kanji, and reading and writing specific classes are offered. Test preparation courses are available for those preparing for a SAT II, AP Test or Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT). Also refresher classes are offered to those who have studied Japanese in high school, college, lived or worked in Japan. Most Monday classes have no mandatory homework.



## Sakura Gakuen Saturday School

provides classes for 6 to 18 year olds with little or no knowledge of Japanese. The teachers are native speakers educated in Japan. Grammatical explanations are given in English. Academic emphasis is on sentence structure, allowing the construction of useful phrases and expressions. Hiragana, katakana and basic kanji characters are introduced. Elements of Japanese culture and traditional games reinforce lessons and keep learning fun. Class sizes range from 5 to 15 students. High school language credit may be available. Open the doors to the world and your future with the Japanese language.

## For over one hundred years

Sakura Gakuen has provided language schooling with an emphasis on Japanese culture, customs and traditions. The school welcomes all. No prior knowledge of Japanese is necessary. The Saturday school is a parent driven school and participants develop a sense of community, mirroring that found in Japan. Potlucks and school sponsored cultural events promote that essence and help motivate students to get up excited on Saturday mornings to learn about the culture and language of Japan. ## Tuition is highly reasonable

relative to comparable schools and is scaled for families with multiple students. Saturday school students may qualify for scholarships. Cultural activities for the Saturday school include Sports Day (Undokai), New Year's (Oshogatsu), Kid's Day (Kodomo no hi), origami, cooking and crafts. Recent field trips have included the San Francisco Cherry Blossom Festival, Golden Gate Park Japanese Tea Garden and the Angel Island Immigration Station. Summer enrichment courses on kanji, calligraphy, and cooking may be offered pending student interest.
